

LOGLINE

An honest collage of internal and external stories centered around family and home, documented during the first coronavirus lockdown.

SYNOPSIS

The day-to-day life in quarantine is placed under the "loupe" and the boundaries of private life are distorted, resulting in a cluster of uncomfortable, candid or amusing situations, filmed mostly on a phone. An ode is paid to the house as the longest witness of the family, a reflection on the past, a place of fight and love, of fear and security.

















DIRECTOR

Agata Olteanu is a third year student at Babes-Bolyai University (Faculty of Theatre and Film), specializing in film directing. In these former years she experimented with many theoretical and practical concepts from which resulted music videos, photography series, an art installation and many other experiments. A constant presence at film festivals, from her high-school years on, involved in internships, workshops she was and volunteering. In 2016, her first short-film "AZI VIN" created during a workshop at Transylvania International Film Festival was awarded the "Let's Go Digital!Award for Best Film".

In her projects, the borders of reality are blurred through a ludic perspective and the status quo is always altered or at least questioned.
